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DEAR FRIENDS OF THE FARM



As we reflect on yet another remarkable year of advancements, partnerships, and programs, I can't help but to be humbled by the tremendous outpouring of support from the wonderful community we are blessed to serve.

2023 was transformative as the Campus literally came out of the ground. The site took shape as grading provided clarity on the location and placement of the key buildings and growing areas. After a significant amount of pumping and hauling, our dutifully dubbed "Muck Mountain" finally dried up and disappeared!

Despite construction challenges, completion of the 1-acre Greenhouse awaits only the final installation of electricity from our partners at OUC. Once activated, the advanced technology of the 9 unique growing systems in the Greenhouse will stand as a first-of-a-kind in the controlled environment agriculture space. Fueled by the biomass from 400 tilapia, the Greenhouse is equipped to produce over 40,000 lbs. of produce a week! The produce will be enjoyed by guests visiting the Farm, restaurant partners, families in need, and...manatees! Yep, our friends at SeaWorld have come by our side to make sure their manatees are some of the very first to enjoy romaine lettuce from our Greenhouse...and a lot of it!

Just behind the Greenhouse will be the longawaited opening of the Education Building. Its unique regenerative design marks it as the only building meeting the Living Building Challenge in the state of FL, and only the second in the Southeast. Our design partners at Little Architecture have much to be proud of already receiving multiple design awards including the FL Educational Planners Assoc Award of Meri, the American Society of Landscape Architects FL Award of Excellence, and the AIA Charlotte Design Award.

2023 brought about the finalization of an agreement with Valencia College which allows students enrolled in their Agriculture and Plant Science classes to work alongside Head Farmer Josh Taylor in bringing the growing systems to life. Among many others, students from OCPS and programs with Orlando Science Center will benefit from the Classrooms this Spring as well.

Another major milestone in 2023 was AdventHealth and Gordon Food Service joining Florida Blue to round out the final partnership for the launch of the Culinary Health Institute (CHI). Joining Dr. Monica Aggarwal, our Chief Medical Officer, the CHI partnership is already hard at work designing the CHI building, planning education classes, research programs, and clinical intervention on the use of food as medicine that will undoubtedly create breakthroughs that will change community health.

Under the leadership of Tommy Ward, Executive Director of 4Roots, programs continued to thrive and expand in both reach and diversity. The Mayors Match Program from the City of Orlando funds after school workshops focused on soil, plant, and nutrition health. Grants from Orlando Health and Orlando City Soccer funded the creation of our program "Rooted In Health" supporting participants at the Salvation Army Catherine Booth Towers in promoting health and wellness. A grant from the USDA enabled us to build and activate the Permaculture Forest, fondly titled the Never-Ending Forage. And Fresh, our farm to home CSA delivery program grew to an astounding 1,100+ household members throughout Central Florida making it one of, if not the largest CSA program in the Southeast.

2024 awaits several exciting new initiatives, including a collaboration with Dr. Phillips Performing Art Center and the Orlando Science Center to host youth summer camps and community-based performances on the Williams Stage. In partnership with Orlando Health, the sponsorship of an interdisciplinary design program with the UCF School of Engineering will bring to market an aerobic biodigester that transforms food waste into solid organic fertilizer.

Looking ahead in construction, we anticipate the opening of the Barn, the Permaculture Forrest, the William's Family Stage, and Community Green in 2024. All the while, we are working toward final drawings, funding, and permitting for the Event Center, Restaurant and Café in anticipation of a 2025 opening.

We are extremely grateful and excited to introduce Chef Michael Collantes as the Culinary Director for the Farm. A recipient of one of the first Michelin Stars in Florida, Chef Michael will orchestrate the farm to table culinary efforts for the entire campus. Additionally, we are excited to share our plans to launch Cooking on the Farm led by the highly decorated and good friend, Chef Norman Van Aken. Along with Chef Michael and guest chefs from around the world, the cooking class series promises to introduce participants to new and exciting cooking techniques from some of the best chefs in the world.

In closing and as always, I cannot express enough gratitude for the tremendous outpouring of support, encouragement, and prayers for our 4Roots Farm project. To think that what started as a dream in 2015 sits only weeks away from planting its first seed humbles me and once again gives me reason to thank God for the amazingly talented team, friends, and community He's surrounded all of us with.

2023 brought forth the launch of Fresh by 4Roots which has since reached 1,100+ members. Fresh is a program housed at 4Roots that offers subscription produce box deliveries of fresh organic items grown by our local farmers.

Now shipping all across Central Florida, community members have easier access to local, seasonal, non-GMO produce that has a guarantee of being grown using a variety of clean growing practices. Fresh is also a proud source of responsibly produced meats, dairy products, eggs, and other pantry essentials.

Fresh has the interest of community health and the prosperity of Florida Farmers as a top priority. Fresh by 4Roots offers the additional advantage of helping to cultivate a more personal connection between local farmers and consumers. With this program, we can support our farmers by increasing sales channels, ultimately alleviating food waste. Fresh produce is SNAP eligible and will be available at our Farmers Markets.





2023 MOBILE MARKET ROLL OUT

The Mobile Market is an exciting initiative set to hit the Orlando roads in 2024. We've transformed a van into a mobile farmers market, equipped with custom technology to maintain the freshness of our produce while on the move. This Mobile Market will have the ability to bring organic local produce to areas that may lack accessibility to such options.



Another remarkable feature of Mobile Market is that it is officially a part of the **Supplemental Nutrition Acceptance Program (SNAP)**, allowing the acceptance of SNAP benefits in exchange for produce. This not only expands our potential reach but also aids our commitment to making healthier food choices accessible to all members of our community.
